Challenge	Requirements - Challenges are included in term programs by Joey Scout Leaders and completed as a Mob except for the Promise Challenge
	<p>Adventure Challenge - Activities to Complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 outings to places unusual to your Mob. Some ideas include zoo, beach, public transport, museums, botanical gardens, bushwalk, farm, city etc. • 1 “Adventure” (super) program.
	<p>Buddy Challenge - Activities to Complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your Mob (Mob A) visits another Mob (Mob B) • Mob B then visits Mob A. • Both Mobs share an outdoor activity, sleepover, or Mob Holiday.
	<p>Care and Share Challenge - Activities to Complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Over a month Joey Scout Leaders run programs on care and share theme. • Special deed done for the local community. <p>Some ideas include visit and gifts to retirement home or hospital, visit and donation of pet food to RSPCA, food hampers for Smith Family etc.</p>
	<p>Environment Challenge - Environmental activities are directed at the Mob rather than the individual Joey Scout. The Project will take the form of four Challenges to be done by the Mob. Four simple environment tasks need to be completed which reflect nature and outdoors.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some ideas include clean up a local park, make a bird feeder and hang it safely in a tree at home, use a PET bottle to make a terrarium, plant some native trees or shrubs, learn what garbage to recycle etc.
	<p>Promise Challenge - Joey Scout must be 7 ½ years of age to do this challenge. Some elements completed away from the Mob. The Promise Challenge involves research and discussion with parents and leaders, as well as a presentation to the Mob. Topics covered include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BP/Scouting History • Duty to God • Duty to Self/Others
